USEUCOM Theater Intelligence Board

1. **Summary.** This charter defines the composition, responsibilities, and authority of the United States European Command (USEUCOM) Theater Intelligence Board (TIB). The TIB provides the USEUCOM J2 and the senior intelligence officer (SIO) of each component and SOCEUR a forum to:

- a. Discuss key issues and topics of common concern.
- b. Resolve issues brought to the TIB by the Theater Intelligence Planners' Council.
- c. Encourage a free and open exchange of views and information.
- d. Validate, issue, and track actions and taskings to improve, intelligence support to theater customers.
- e. Provide advice and counsel to the USEUCOM J2 on the command's intelligence strategy, architecture, and implementation plans.

2. **Applicability.** This Directive applies to HQ USEUCOM and Component Intelligence directorates/staff offices in the USEUCOM Area of Responsibility (AOR).

3. **Internal Control Systems.** This Directive contains no internal control provisions and is not subject to the requirements of the internal management control program. For HQ USEUCOM and subordinate joint activities, the applicable internal control directive is ED 50-8, Internal Management Control Program.

4. **Suggested Improvements.** The proponent for this Directive is the Strategies and Architectures Branch, Intel Plans Division, Intelligence Directorate (J2). Suggested improvements should be forwarded to HQ USEUCOM, ATTN: ECJ25-P, Unit 30400, Box 1000, APO AE 09128.

6. **Definitions.**

- a. CJCSI 3110.02. The CJCSI 3110.02 states that commands should use the C4ISR Integrated Architecture Program (CIAP) to document mission-linkage of current and future intelligence requirements, describe command intelligence missions and capabilities, and document command intelligence capability requirements.
- b. CIAP. The CIAP is a program that documents mission-linkage of current and future intelligence requirements, command intelligence missions and capabilities, and command intelligence capability requirements.
- c. CISD. The CISD is a CIAP product that articulates the USEUCOM intelligence strategy. It is approved by the USEUCOM J2 with advice and counsel from the TIB. The CISD identifies the TIB as an important element of the USEUCOM intelligence strategy.
- d. CIAD. The CIAD is a CIAP product that describes the planning environment, contains both baseline and objective intelligence architectures, and assesses shortfalls in capabilities required for future operational missions.
- e. CIID. The CIID is a CIAP product that conveys the top USEUCOM intelligence planning priorities approved by the USEUCOM J2 with guidance from the TIB. This prioritized list is used by all USEUCOM intelligence activities to shape and justify Program Objective Memorandums (POMs).
- f. Theater Intelligence Conference (TIC). The TIC provides the USEUCOM J2 senior staff and senior intelligence representatives of the components, SOCEUR, and the national intelligence agencies a quarterly forum to discuss and resolve key issues and topics of common concern.
- g. Theater Intelligence Planners' Council (TIPC). The TIPC provides the theater's intelligence planners a quarterly forum to discuss key issues and topics of common concern, foster interaction among the theater intelligence planning staff, encourage a free and open exchange of views and information, track and implement TIB actions and taskings.

7. **Authorities.** The TIB is authorized to:

- a. Approve, disapprove, and arbitrate intelligence issues affecting the theater.
- b. Establish theater intelligence policy and directives.
- c. Delegate intelligence authority commensurate with established agreements, regulations and directives, to components, SOCEUR, ECJ2 Divisions, or national intelligence agencies.

8. **Responsibilities.**

- a. Ensure an active and open forum for SIOs to address and resolve theater intelligence issues.
- b. Develop theater positions/understanding on all planning issues.
- c. Provide guidance on intelligence architectures and plans based on established policy and directives.
- d. Address intelligence shortfalls and provide guidance to overcome those shortfalls.
- e. Resolve resource allocation issues as they relate to intelligence architectures and plans.
- f. Publish minutes of each TIB and monitor status of action items.

9. **Membership.**

- a. USEUCOM Director of Intelligence as Chairman (Deputy Director of Intelligence as a non-voting member)
- b. USAFE/IN
- c. USAREUR/DCSINT
- d. NAVEUR/N2
- e. MARFOREUR/G2
- f. SOCEUR/J2
- g. ECJ25 as recorder

10. **Charter Implementation.** This charter shall become effective upon the approval of the USEUCOM Chief of Staff.

11. **Review & Implementation.**

a. Term. The term of this Charter is indefinite.

b. Review and Amendment. This charter shall be reviewed annually by the TIB and may be amended by majority vote of the members and approval of the USEUCOM/CS.
